- EIPS new Superintendent, Sandra Stoddard
- EIPS new Associate Superintendent, Supports for Students, Ryan Marshall
- Previous board chair Trina Boymook has stepped down and EIPS welcomes
 Cathy Allen as the new board chair. Colleen Holowaychuk, previous vice chair
 has also stepped down and Susan Miller will now be in this role
- August 23: the board participated in professional learning session which focused on building a first-team mindset

- Teachers are busy back in the classroom and in various coaching and staff roles through sports programs
- Welcome back to students, parents, and staff

10. Administration Report - MJ Nam

- Current Status and Issues: Enrolment at approx 828 students; funding has decreased by approx \$120,000 despite same number of students; funding has changed from credits/student to block funding (similar to elementary) which is difficult for course offerings and their expenses
- AJS continues to be a closed-boundary school
- School Education Plan has been submitted:
 - GOAL 1: Student engagement at AJS
 - Student academic, social and emotional engagement will increase by leveraging student-centered practices in all subject areas
 - GOAL 2: High Quality Teaching and Learning Environment
 - Developing and leveraging teacher capacity to provide differentiated instruction, students will experience growth in knowledge, skills, and attitudes to become confident and competent learners as indicated by assessment data collected throughout the school year
 - GOAL 3: Students develop positive and effective citizenship skills and behaviour
 - By assessing students' interests in curricular and extra-curricular learning activities and implementing those that facilitate pride in themselves and their school, AJS students will feel safe, respected, and treated fairly at school and well-prepared for life
- October 17 and 19: Student-Parent-Teacher Conferences; bookings open on October 11 at 4 pm through schoolinterviews.ca

Facilities Update - Lonnie Hicks

- Jr High Art Room updated renovations (funded by facilities)
- Food Sciences: 6 kitchens upgraded to 8 kitchens (funded by facilities)
- New minibus: amortized over 10 years (funded by vending machine & cafeteria sales)

<u>Technology Update - Trudi Williamson</u>

- New all-in-one computers have been installed in 3 labs and for each staff computer (EIPS Evergreening fund)
- Windows 11 cart of laptops purchased (EIPS Evergreening fund)
- Next year: chromebooks expire and will no longer be able to be managed by EIPS IT department; will need to purchase MANY new chromebooks
